



St. Peter's Cathedral Celebrates Successful Sunday School Training

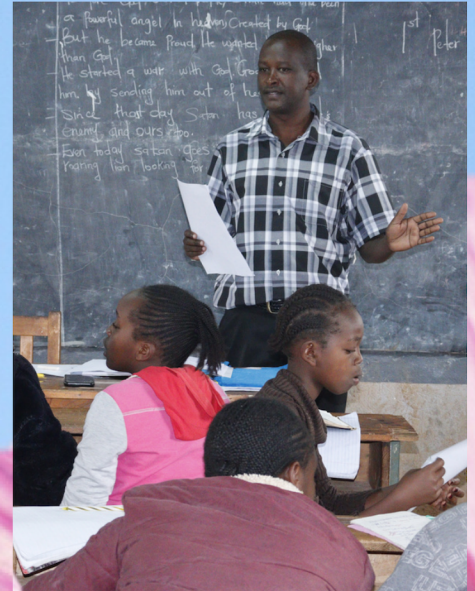
